### **From The Pastor**

As I write this, it is Thanksgiving week; this coming Sunday will begin the season of Advent. Advent, which refers to "coming," is the season when Christians prepare for the coming of God's gift of love wrapped in the human form of a baby, who grew up to become the embodiment of God's Love, Light and Hope for the world.

It seems that our world needs God's Love, Light and Hope today more than ever (though I guess most times in history have seemed needy as well!). In the United States we were battered by harsh rhetoric and namecalling and abuses throughout the presidential campaign; now we are trying to find our footing as we wait to see how the results of the election will change our lives and the lives of others who live in our country.

The world situation seems even worse, as threats abound, bombings wipe out hospitals in Aleppo, and refugee families are repeatedly turned away from countries overwhelmed by their needs. There seems little to trust in this world, near and far. Scandals keep breaking, cheating in the Olympic Games is once again in the news, leaders cannot seem to find reason or ways to cooperate. All while drug addiction keeps on killing our children and our neighbors. We need God's Love, Light and Hope!!

So we look to Christmas, perhaps with spirits wondering if anything about it can really make a real difference this year. Children love it. Parents sometimes struggle with it, especially financially. For many, the season makes memories more painful and grief heavier. I have heard people say, "For me, it's just something to get through..."

If we were just remembering an act long ago, the birth of Jesus Christ, we might get tired of Christmas or even give it up. Peggy Lee's old song, "Is That All There Is?", might be appropriate. Thankfully, that's NOT all there is!! Because Advent and Christmas may point to a holy night some 2000 years ago, but

they are really about God at work in our dark world TODAY! And when God is at work, there is nothing old or even predictable about it!!

In our darkness, whether it's failing health, fear of the future, despair over our children, a broken relationship (death, divorce, disagreement, etc.), loss of a job, depression, grief, homelessness, WHATEVER, God can shine a light and give hope and let us know that we are loved. Most of the time God works through other people to shine the light, but sometimes God just "snuggles" us, so that the darkness lifts a bit and our hearts become warmer and a little hope sneaks in. However God does it, that's what Christmas is really about: God reaching into our dark worlds to give us a new way of looking at and living life!

I close with a prayer, gleaned and then edited a bit from *Worship & Song*, # 8:

God of glory,

Your splendor shines from a manger in Bethlehem into the darkness of human night.

Open our eyes to Christ's presence in the shadows of our world

so that we, like him, may become beacons of your justice, sharers of your light,

and defenders of all for whom there is no room. Amen.
